

God and evil. And, from the beginning, Adam and Eve chose to disobey God which resulted in our separation from fellowship with our heavenly Father. In order to have us return to fellowship, God gave us the Ten Commandments through Moses to remind us to love God and to love our neighbor. Repeatedly God sent us judges and prophets to have us turn back. Instead, we constructed religious systems that imprisoned us to rules and restrictions which have caused so many of us to feel guilt and unworthiness. How could God show us that He loves us and doesn't want to punish us? In order to fulfill the Mosaic covenant of sacrifice for the

atonement of sin, we know that, in the midst of darkness under cruel Roman occupation, God sent his Son in human form to redeem humanity from the dark and heavy cloak of political, religious, physical, and personal oppression - not with a

mighty warrior king but through a child, a baby. And, as that Baby grew into adulthood, Jesus showed us that God's kingdom is about forgiveness, compassion, tolerance, respect for one another and, especially, love. Jesus forgave sinners, healed the sick, encouraged the brokenhearted, and accepted the outcast. Jesus showed us what the kingdom of God would look like. So, as we enter the season of Advent, we remember that God has healed us to heal our neighbors with the love and compassion of Jesus. In doing so, we give the world a peak into what God's kingdom would look like. When we are kind, compassionate, forgiving, and loving, people can catch a glimpse into the kingdom of God.

But, as I have said so many times in sermons, God's kingdom is here, but not yet. So, this Advent, as we await the arrival of Jesus, we know that, as the followers of Jesus, we are called to invite others be reconciled to God. God doesn't want to be separated from humanity; God wants to be in fellowship with us. But, God won't force us because God is love. As Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "Love is patient; love is kind... It does not insist on its own way... (love) bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." God never forces us to love us; so, God simply loves us and showed us that love on the Cross at Golgotha and, as John stated so simply and beautifully, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." We don't have to be perfect; God loves us just as we are. So, as we await the birth and return of the Son of God, let us join the chorus of witness of the past, present, and future and sing joyfully together, "O, Come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant... O, come let us adore him, Christ the Lord!

Sunday December 3rd 2 and 6 pm


