mantic picture of harmony in the early chapters of the Acts of the Apostles, we know that the early church was beset with problems and Paul confirmed that in his letters, especially in his letters to the Corinthians.

But, even though St. Timothy is in a time of uncertainty, the symptoms of unrest and doubt haven't been present in our faith community as expressed by some of my interim colleagues in our last meeting. As I shared with them, St. Timothy has been blessed by strong lay leadership and a healthy willingness of

members to help when asked. Our recognition and gratitude of volunteers on April 21 was evidence of that spirit.



Another example of St. Timothy teamwork is the results

of the Congregational Retreat on April 14. In many of the congregational retreats that I've been a part of, we would spend several hours brainstorming and writing ideas on poster paper about what we hoped to accomplish in the next year or two. Then, at the end of the Retreat, we'd roll up the poster paper and it would end up somewhere in the church office. Sometimes the goals might be addressed but most of the time they were forgotten and might surface again at the following year's Retreat. But, St. Timothy's approach is different.

What the members at the April 14 Retreat accomplished in a little over an hour (compared to several hours in other Retreats I've been a part of...) was three goals which were Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Reasonable, and Time-measured (SMART). Because the goals set in the Retreat are SMART, our congregation will know if we've succeeded or fallen short. And, even if we fall short, we have a tangible way to make adjustments and improvements. But, the success or failure is the responsibility, not of just the Retreat participants, but of every

member of St. Timothy in volunteering, supporting, and praying to accomplish those goals.

So, what are we hoping to accomplish this year? In planning for our Retreat, I wanted St. Tim's for focus on Evangelism: Outreach, Inreach, and Fellowship & Ministry. After Brainstorming and offering ideas, each Retreat Task Force came up with the following goals:

Evangelism (Outreach): BY SEPTEMBER 2024, ST. TIMOTHY WILL CONDUCT AT LEAST ONE NEIGHORHOOD CLEANUP.

Evangelism (Inreach): BY JUNE 1, EACH TEAM MEMBER WILL BE ASSIGNED AN ITEM ON THE ASSESSMENT QUESTIONNAIRE CARD TO DEVELOP AND BY JULY 1, THE ASSESSMENT CARDS WILL BE MAILED OUT.

Evangelism (Fellowship & Ministry): ON THE FIRST AND THIRD SUNDAYS OF MAY, JUNE AND JULY HAVE COOKIES AVAILABLE TO TAKE HOME FOR WORSHIPPERS.

The success and realization of those goals are not dependent on the Task Force members, but on every member of St. Tim to support and help.

And, when all the members of St. Tim work together as a team and put our hands to our tasks, the Holy Spirit will anoint us with the oil of gladness so we can lift our hands in praise and proclaim, "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity." - Pr. H

Social Concerns

Food Pantry: We served 77 in March and 81 so far in April. We have been very blessed with donations from our members and then on April 13th from Portland Food Project of 700 pounds. Thank you, Cheryl Nelson, Sherry Willmschen, and Pastor Yukio for volunteering at the distribution site and Ray Whitford for helping put the food in the pantry on the 13th. Thanks to Karen



Olumua, Cheryl and Jean Whitford for putting the food on pantry shelves and overflow shelves. We three volunteers on-site have many stories of the people assisted with 1 bag per adult. Prior to Easter Jubilee, fliers and treats were given to families with children. We also share information about other agencies that might be able to help. For houseless people, besides our presence on 211, we share information on the resource of Cultivate Initiatives who provide help with jobs, showers, etc.

Snow-Cap: We delivered used clothing

and egg cartons in April.

Our Just Future: Shelters are providing opportunities to provide meals. Information will be shared for the opportunity in the future.

Cultivate Initiatives: We continue to support their outreach and support for our neighbors.

Easter Lily distribution:

Karen Olomua and I delivered Lilies to some of our homebound members. I delivered to Marcia Severson—left on porch and she called later to express her gratitude. Delivered to Kevin who was delighted to have a visitor and needs size Medium clothes—Karen O is on it. Loved visiting Fred Warren—he is finding it more difficult to remember, but glad for the Lily. Left one at the Knudson's and got a wonderful message of thanks from the 3 of them. Leslie
