to thank him. That might be a message for modern-day America as we spend the day relaxing, watching football games on TV, and stuffing ourselves with turkey and all the fixings. Like the one leper who returned to thank Jesus, may we stop and honestly thank God for all of our blessings.

History reminds us that, at the height of the Civil War in 1863, President Abraham Lincoln issued a Thanksgiving Day proclamation encouraging Americans "in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea, and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Prayer to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens." So, despite all turbulence and trouble of today, as in Lincoln's Civil War America, let us pause and set aside this November 28 as a "Day of Thanksgiving and Prayer to our beneficent Father who dwells in the heavens."

Of course, we members of St. Timothy, celebrate The Great Thanksgiving every Sunday in Holy Communion, as we proclaim, "It is right to give God thanks and praise" and I respond "It is indeed right that in all times and places we should give thanks... and join with the choirs

of angels... and all the hosts of heaven,,, followed by our singing "Holy, Holy, Holy, God of power and might..." Maybe, like our national day of thanksgiving, we sometimes take the Great Thanksgiving for granted. **But, this year many stop and remember that God has done something amazingly gracious for us** 

#### in giving all of humankind God's one and only Son, Jesus Christ, to take away the sin of the world.

So, despite all the bad news that enshrouds the world with cloaks of darkness, let us remember Paul's encouragement to the Thessalonians, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." So, while it may be hard to give thanks for the horrible circumstances of the embattled and beleaguered Gazan and West Bank Palestinians, the Lebanese, the Ukrainians, Sudanese, and the people enduring war and oppression, let trust that God is there even in the midst of all of that. And, because God is there, we know that God can speak into the darkness as God spoke into the void of creation and said, "Let there be light" and it was good. Let us pray and give thanks that God is ultimately in control and there will be light. At the Last Supper, Jesus taught the disciples, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give unto you, not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." May those words be a reality for us so that we be able to thank God and our hearts will not be troubled nor afraid. God is with us! God loves us! THANKS **BE TO GOD!!!**

Food Pantry: Our food pantry remains very busy with many varied shoppers from people on the street to those supporting families of 7. Useage is highest the last two weeks of the month. Thanks to all those who ship to help keep our shelves stocked. We also are blessed by Portland Food Project and had our delivery on the 12th of October with numerous members volunteering to receive 700+ pounds of food. We also received \$500 Winco gift card which will be used to purchase food when our cupboards become bare. Special thanks to Cheryl and Karen O for stepping forward to volunteer at the pantry due to Jean's illness.

Shopping can be challenging. Here are some hints to help our shoppers for the pantry and possibly for your own home: 1. The first Saurday of the month bread at the Franz Outlet on Foster is just \$1 a loaf off the back wall. Wednesday is senior day at the outlet.

2. Other senior discounts include: 1st Tuesday a Fred Meyers with their rewards card. You can get coupons or clip coupons to get cereal for \$1.79.

Grocery Outlet has daily discount with their discount card until noon. The best day to shop Gresham Outlet is Thursday due to restocking.

If you have other tricks please let Sherry or Karen O know.

Remember shoppers, you can get reimbursed for your purchases. **Snow-Cap:** We continue to support this agency with egg cartons and used clothing in good shape. Recent news is that they have purchased Crown Carpets in Gresham to be remodeled to provide a place for clients to shop for used clothing. Currently the items are available in Gresham Station.
